

This month we remember HONG KONG

This month we remember Canadian soldiers who served in Hong Kong during the Second World War. On August 30, 1945, Hong Kong was liberated by Allied forces after nearly four years under Japanese occupation. The defence of Hong Kong was a brutal chapter in Canada's military history. Of the almost 2,000 Canadians who sailed to Hong Kong in late 1941, more than 550 would never see Canada again. Many would die in the fierce combat of December 1941. Others would perish in the grinding conditions of the Japanese prison camps throughout the rest of the war. Many of those who did survive would return home with their health broken and their lives shortened, forever shaken by their experiences and the extreme hardships they endured.






